Who are we? The Charlottesville-Albemarle Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) and Thomas Jefferson Planning District Commission (TJPDC) are the agencies where County, City, and State policy-makers determine which major transportation projects to plan and build over the next 25 years.

What is UnJAM 2035? Every five years an MPO is required by the federal government to update its regional transportation plan. It is now time to update our existing UnJAM 2025 plan. UnJAM 2035 will build on the issues and concerns from the previous plan, taking into account new topics and goals.
